Classroom Library

Are the books....

- at a variety of reading levels?
- set in different locations and time periods?
- representing a variety of sexes and genders?
- representing a variety of races and ethnicities?
- representing individuals of all abilities?
- using images that are culturally appropriate and accurate?
- written in a variety of languages?

Seating Arrangement

Do the seating options in the classroom...

- provide opportunities for traditional seating (i.e. table and chairs or desks)?
- provide opportunities for non-traditional seating (i.e. couches, cushions, bean bags, stools, etc.)?
- create a collaborative workspace where students can work together?
- create a quiet space for individuals to work alone if needed?
- include students of all abilities (i.e. students in wheelchairs)?
- create a flow for the teacher to move about the room easily?

Decorations

Do the decorations in the classroom...

- include posters representing a variety of students (i.e. sexes, races, ethnicities, genders, abilities, etc.?
- include languages for all students in the classroom?
- showcase upcoming events in the community?
- match the age of the students?
- match the interests of the students?
- reinforce classroom themes of respect, diversity, tolerance, and community?
- display classroom expectations and "rules"?

Curriculum

- providing accurate and up-to-date information?
- telling the story from multiple perspectives?
- using images that are culturally appropriate and accurate?
- being supplemented with additional resources when necessary?

Information Presentation

When presenting information to the class are you...

- using a variety of teaching strategies?

- using images to reinforce written or oral content?
- taking time to clarify or answer any questions?
- using age-appropriate language?
- translating to other languages when needed?
- highlighting important vocabulary words and terms?

Story/Word Problems

Do the story/word problems...

- use a variety of items from various cultures?
- using diverse names?
- exhibit items or names from the culture of your students?
- clearly identify or help students identify important pieces of information?
- have the ability to be translated to a different language if needed?

Assessments

Are the assessments in the classroom...

- available in multiple forms?
- available in multiple languages if needed?
- able to be modified for various levels?
- adjustable for TAG or IEP/504 students?
- appropriately assessing the most important aspects of a lesson?
- contributing to a student's overall learning?
- providing supports for students where needed?
