VA COLA Increase Video https:// www.youtube.com/watch?v=74RLj-kjEy0 The new 2024 VA disability rates will be effective December 1, 2023, and disabled veterans will see the new **3.2%** COLA increase on their January 1, 2024, VA payment. Disabled veterans with a current VA disability rating of 10% or higher will receive a 3.2% increase in their VA disability pay rate for calendar year 2024.

To calculate your increase

 Look at what your last deposit was for your 2023 monthly payment (before deductions) and multiply that amount by 1.032. Example: We will use a single veteran with a 30% disability rating as an example and the 2023 rate is \$508.05. \$508.05 x 1.032 = \$524.31. The veterans pay will increase by \$16.26 to \$524.31.
Then subtract any deductions that are coming out of your pay. That will be your new disability pay for 2024.

Remember: Disability payments are non-taxable income and you WILL NOT receive a 1099 or W2. Military retirement pay is taxable and you should receive a tax document.

Veteran Eligibility Requirements:

The Veteran must have a serious injury, which is a single or combined service-connected disability rating of 70% or more, and meet the following eligibility requirements to participate in the Program of Comprehensive Assistance for Family Caregivers:

- The individual is either:
 - A Veteran; or
 - A member of the Armed Forces undergoing a medical discharge from the Armed Forces.

The individual has a serious injury (serious injury now includes serious illness) incurred or aggravated in the line of duty in the active military, naval, or air service:

- On or after September 11, 2001; or
- Effective on the date specified in a future Federal Register document, on or before May 7, 1975; or
- Effective two years after the date specified in a future Federal Register document, after May 7, 1975 and before September 11, 2001.

3 The individual is in need of in-person personal care services for a minimum of six continuous months based on any one of the following:

- An inability to perform an activity of daily living; or
- A need for supervision, protection, or instruction.
- It is in the best interest of the individual to participate in the program.

5 Personal care services that would be provided by the Family Caregiver will not be simultaneously and regularly provided by or through another individual or entity.

The individual receives care at home or will do so if VA designates a Family Caregiver.



The individual receives ongoing care from a Primary Care Team or will do so if VA designates a Family Caregiver.

Family Caregiver Eligibility Requirements

For you to be eligible to be a Family Caregiver you must:



Be at least 18 years of age.



- The eligible Veteran's spouse, son, daughter, parent, stepfamily member, or extended family member; or
- Someone who lives with the eligible Veteran full-time or will do so if designated as a Family Caregiver.
- Be initially assessed by VA as being able to complete caregiver education and training.
- Complete caregiver training and demonstrate the ability to carry out the specific personal care services, core competencies, and additional care requirements.

In addition, there must be no determination by VA of abuse or neglect of the eligible Veteran by the caregiver.

Inability to Perform Activity of Daily Living (ADL)

The "inability to perform an ADL" means the Veteran or service member requires personal care services **each** *time* he or she completes one or more of the ADLs listed below.

- Dressing or undressing oneself
- Bathing
- Grooming oneself in order to keep oneself clean and presentable
- Adjusting any special prosthetic or orthopedic appliance, that by reason of the particular disability cannot be done without assistance (this does not include the adjustment of appliances that nondisabled persons would be unable to adjust without aid, such as supports, belts, lacing at the back, etc.)
- Toileting or attending to toileting
- Feeding oneself due to loss of coordination of upper extremities, extreme weakness, inability to swallow, or the need for a non-oral means of nutrition
- Mobility (walking, going up stairs, transferring from bed to chair, etc.)

Requiring assistance with an ADL only some of the time does not meet the definition of an "inability to perform an ADL."

Stipend Levels:

As an eligible Primary Family Caregiver, you may qualify to receive a monthly stipend, which is paid at one of two levels. Here are the details:

- If a Veteran meets all seven eligibility requirements (listed above), then VA must determine whether the Veteran is "unable to self-sustain in the community."
- Level One: If VA determines that a Veteran is not "unable to self-sustain in the community" the designated Primary Family Caregiver will receive the lower-level stipend payment.

Level Two: If VA determines the Veteran is "unable to self-sustain in the community" the designated Primary Family Caregiver will receive the higher-level stipend payment.

Tips for Filing a Successful VA Claim for Benefits

Filing A Successful Claim for VA Benefits

To file a **successful** claim, you need **three things**:

- A current, diagnosed disability,
- An in-service event, injury, or illness; and
- A medical nexus between the current disability and the in-service event, injury, or illness (a link between 1 and 2).

To prove your claim you need to provide (if you have them):

- 1) Your medical diagnosis, information, and records
- 2) Your military medical records if you have them
- Any and all documentation that could help support your claim

Every claim is unique and will have different factors for Veterans Affairs to consider. IN-COUNTRY

Veterans who were on active duty: You were on active duty for the duration of your contract-night and day. Even when you were on liberty, you were still considered active-duty. There was no "off-time" for you on active duty service. You were legally obligated to the government 24 hours a day. This is why you can file a claim for ANY illness or injury that happened while you were on active duty (this is what the cartoon is referencing. There was no such thing as 40 hours a week for active duty).

You need 3 things: an illness / injury that happened in the service; a current medical diagnosis; and a link between the two (unless it is a presumptive condition i.e. Agent Orange or PACT Act). Contact me to file a claim! I'm here to help.

- ⇒ DD-214 (or, discharge documents)
- ⇒ List of current diagnoses/reoccurring diagnoses (a medical chart note helps)
- ⇒ List of current, private medical doctors (their name, address, phone number, and when treatment began and ended (if ended)
- \Rightarrow Your VA Facility name (s)
- ⇒ Any military medical records or records documenting injuries in the service or, related medical care to support your claim (if you have any)
- ⇒ A voided check or bank deposit slip that includes: your bank name, routing

number, and account number (VA benefits applications ask for this information for direct deposit)

Appointments with the TVSO are usually an hour long.

1) You will sign a HIPAA form and a POA form that allows me to assist with filing your claim.

2) I will do an Intake interview and based on what you decide, we will file a claim.

3) Contact me today for an appointment as soon as possible!

Remember: If you never ask, it is always no!
